

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

between

**Cabarrus College of Health Sciences
Bachelor of Science Degree in Medical Imaging
Online Management Option**

and

**Randolph Community College
Associate of Science Degree in Radiography**

Purpose:

This Agreement records the understanding between two imaging programs, the Medical Imaging (MI) Program at Cabarrus College of Health Sciences and the Radiography (RAD) Program at Randolph Community College (RCC) to maximize students' transfer of credit from RCC toward a Bachelor of Science degree in Imaging at Cabarrus College.

Eligibility:

Second year RCC RAD students may enroll concurrently as a "non-degree student" in up to six credits per semester at Cabarrus College. Permission will be required from program officials at both RCC and Cabarrus College. Enrollment will be on a space available basis. To be eligible, students must meet the following requirements:

- cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above
- minimum ACT (18 composite) or SAT (430 Reading; 380 Math)

RCC Associate of Science Degree in Radiography graduates (ASR) who meet the following criteria will be eligible to enter Cabarrus College's Bachelor of Science Degree in Imaging Program:

- cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above
- either current active registry or registry eligible status with the AART
- two professional references, one from current supervisor or imaging faculty member

Application Fee:

The Cabarrus College application fee will be waived for those who apply in accordance with this agreement.

Articulation Guide Review:

The Articulation Guide is subject to review every two years. The agreement will be reviewed and updated to accommodate curriculum changes at Cabarrus College and Randolph Community College.

Financial Assistance:

Graduates of the Radiography program from RCC who enter Cabarrus College's BSMI degree program may be eligible for an Allied Health Transfer Scholarship. See Exhibit A for details.

Promotion/Outreach:

RCC and Cabarrus College agree to publicize this agreement through marketing and information sessions, and to promote successful transfer through active student advising.


Renewal/Renegotiation:

This Articulation Agreement shall remain in full force and effect until terminated in writing by either imaging program.

The imaging programs agree to review, update and amend this Articulation Agreement as needed, particularly with any curricular change. Either imaging program may initiate the review process of this Articulation Agreement or a curricular change. Any amendment to this Articulation Agreement shall be signed by authorized representatives of the imaging programs and attached as an addendum hereto.



EXHIBIT A

The North Carolina Community College (NCCC) Allied Health Transfer Scholarship:

1. The NCCC Allied Health Transfer Scholarship is offered to new undergraduate transfer students who:
 - a. Transfer from an accredited North Carolina Community College; and
 - b. Have a Community College cumulative GPA of 3.0; and
 - c. Enroll full-time in one of the following Allied Health baccalaureate degree programs: Biomedical Sciences, Community Health & Wellness, Health Sciences Leadership and Development, Medical Imaging or Respiratory Therapy.
2. The scholarship does not require a separate scholarship application. To apply, submit:
 - a. *Completed* application for admission; and
 - b. *Official* North Carolina Community College transcript; and the
 - c. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov (use Cabarrus College code 015358).
3. The scholarship is stackable (e.g., may be used in conjunction with other scholarships/awards)
4. The maximum award amount is \$1500 maximum/academic year

The Phi Theta Kappa Transfer Scholarship:

1. The Phi Theta Kappa Transfer Scholarship is offered to new undergraduate transfer students who:
 - a. Have been inducted into the Phi Theta Kappa National Honor Society
2. The scholarship does not require a separate scholarship application. To apply, submit:
 - a. Proof of membership into Phi Theta Kappa to the Office of Financial Aid; and the
 - b. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov (use Cabarrus College code 015358).
3. The scholarship is stackable (e.g., may be used in conjunction with other scholarships/awards)
4. The maximum award amount is \$1000 maximum/academic year.

The Transfer Student Legacy Scholarship:

1. The Alumni Legacy Scholarship is offered to new undergraduate transfer students who:
 - a. Are dependents of a previous Cabarrus College graduate.
2. The scholarship does not require a separate scholarship application. To apply, submit:
 - a. Proof of affiliation by providing the alumna name, degree, and year of graduation to the Office of Financial Aid; and the
 - b. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov (use Cabarrus College code 015358)
3. The scholarship is stackable (e.g., may be used in conjunction with other scholarships/awards)
4. The maximum award amount is \$500 maximum/academic year.

Atrium Health Teammate Dependent Scholarship

Institutional aid award for new students who enroll full-time directly from a community college. New students are automatically reviewed and considered for this award.

1. The Atrium Health Teammate Dependent Scholarship is offered to a new, full-time student who is:
 - a. Newly admitted to Cabarrus College of Health Sciences; and
 - b. Pursuing a first degree (not a second degree); and
 - c. Whose parent/guardian is currently employed by Atrium Health.
2. The scholarship does not require a separate scholarship application. To apply, submit a:
 - a. *Completed* application for admission; and
 - b. *Completed* Employment Verification Form; and the
 - c. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov (use Cabarrus College code 015358).
3. The scholarship is stackable (e.g., may be used in conjunction with other scholarships/awards)
4. The maximum award amount is \$1000/academic year.
